Together let us entrust 2023 to Jesus Christ!



On Monday, the country celebrates Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. on this, the 94 th anniversary of his birth.

Dr. King is one of the most important African-American leaders in U.S. history and one of the iconic figures of the civil rights movement in the United States during the 1950s and 1960s. Dr. King's fight against discrimination and segregation changed American history and gave hope to millions looking towards a future of equality.

One of the most inspiring moments of Dr. King's life was the August 28, 1963, March on Washington, and his "I Have a Dream" speech, where he stated, "I have a dream that my four children will one day live in a nation where they will not be judged by the color of their skin but by the content of their character."

In his address to the United States Congress and to the nation on September 24, 2015, Pope Francis noted the importance of Dr. King's dream, as one that continues to inspire Americans and people from around the world to this day: "Here too I think of the march which Martin Luther King led from Selma to Montgomery fifty years ago as part of the campaign to fulfill his "dream" of full civil and political rights for African Americans. That dream continues to inspire us all. I am happy that America continues to be, for many, a land of "dreams," dreams which lead to action, to participation, to commitment, dreams which awaken what is deepest and truest in the life of a people," said Pope Francis.


King's call for racial equality is echoed in the Catechism of the Catholic Church. "Created in the image of the one God and equally endowed with rational souls, all men have the same nature and the same origin. Redeemed by the sacrifice of Christ, all are called to participate in the same divine beatitude: all therefore enjoy an equal dignity." (CCC 1934).

In his remarks, Pope Francis noted that King's message of equality is rooted in the Gospel passage of the Golden Rule. "Do unto others as you would have them do unto you" (Mt 7:12). As the Holy Father stated: "This Rule points us in a clear direction. Let us treat others with the same passion and compassion with which we want to be treated. Let us seek for others the same possibilities which we seek for ourselves. Let us help others to grow, as we would like to be helped ourselves. In a word, if we want security, let us give security; if we want life, let us give life; if we want opportunities, let us provide opportunities. The yardstick we use for others will be the yardstick which time will use for us. The Golden Rule also reminds us of our responsibility to protect and defend human life at every stage of its development."

Recent events demonstrate that we still have much work to do to achieve the racial equality of which King dreamed. It is clear that the wounds and effects of slavery and segregation remain enormous challenges facing our country, its citizens, and its policymakers.

Moreover, other forms of inequality continue to be problems that degrade the dignity of man. As the Catechism states, "There exist also sinful inequalities that affect millions of men and women...Excessive economic and social disparity between individuals and peoples of the one human race is a source of scandal and militates against social justice, equity, human dignity, as well as social and international peace." (CCC 1938).

Yet, while the struggle began by Dr. Martin Luther King and others continues, Pope Francis reminds us not to lose hope: "Building a nation calls us to recognize that we must constantly relate to others, rejecting a mindset of hostility in order to adopt one of reciprocal subsidiarity, in a constant effort to do our best. I am confident that we can do this."



Este lunes, el país celebra al Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. en este, el 94 aniversario de su nacimiento.

El Dr. King es uno de los líderes afroamericanos más importantes en la historia de los Estados Unidos y una de las figuras icónicas del movimiento por los derechos civiles en los Estados Unidos durante las décadas de 1950 y 1960. La lucha del Dr. King contra la discriminación y la segregación cambió la historia de Estados Unidos y dio esperanza a millones de personas que buscan un futuro de igualdad.

Uno de los momentos más inspiradores de la vida del Dr. King fue la Marcha en Washington del 28 de agosto de 1963 y su discurso "Tengo un sueño", donde dijo: "Tengo el sueño de que mis cuatro hijos algún día vivirán en una nación donde no serán juzgados por el color de su piel sino por el contenido de su carácter".

En su discurso ante el Congreso de los Estados Unidos y la nación el 24 de septiembre de 2015, el Papa Francisco destacó la importancia del sueño del Dr. King, como uno que continúa inspirando a los estadounidenses y a la gente de todo el mundo hasta el día de hoy: "Aquí también yo Piense en la marcha que Martin Luther King encabezó desde Selma a Montgomery hace cincuenta años como parte de la campaña para cumplir su "sueño" de plenos derechos civiles y políticos para los afroamericanos. Ese sueño continúa inspirándonos a todos. Estoy feliz de que América siga siendo,

para muchos, una tierra de "sueños", sueños que llevan a la acción, a la participación, al compromiso, sueños que despiertan lo más profundo y verdadero en la vida de un pueblo", dijo el Papa Francisco.

El llamado de King a la igualdad racial se repite en el Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica. "Creados a imagen del único Dios e igualmente dotados de almas racionales, todos los hombres tienen la misma naturaleza y el mismo origen. Redimidos por el sacrificio de Cristo, todos están llamados a participar de la misma bienaventuranza divina: por tanto, todos gozan de igual dignidad". (CEC 1934).

En sus comentarios, el Papa Francisco señaló que el mensaje de igualdad de King tiene sus raíces en el pasaje evangélico de la Regla de Oro. "Haced con los demás lo que queráis que hagan con vosotros" (Mt 7,12). Como dijo el Santo Padre: "Esta Regla nos señala una dirección clara. Tratemos a los demás con la misma pasión y compasión con la que queremos ser tratados. Busquemos para los demás las mismas posibilidades que buscamos para nosotros. Ayudemos a otros a crecer, como nos gustaría ser ayudados a nosotros mismos. En una palabra, si queremos seguridad, demos seguridad; si queremos vida, demos vida; si queremos oportunidades, proporcionemos oportunidades. La vara de medir que usamos para los demás será la vara de medir que el tiempo usará para nosotros. La Regla de Oro también nos recuerda nuestra responsabilidad de proteger y defender la vida humana en cada etapa de su desarrollo".

Los acontecimientos recientes demuestran que todavía tenemos mucho trabajo por hacer para lograr la igualdad racial con la que King soñó. Está claro que las heridas y los efectos de la esclavitud y la segregación siguen siendo enormes desafíos que enfrentan nuestro país, sus ciudadanos y sus legisladores.

Además, otras formas de desigualdad continúan siendo problemas que degradan la dignidad del hombre. Como dice el Catecismo, "Existen también desigualdades perniciosas que afectan a millones de hombres y mujeres... La disparidad económica y social excesiva entre los individuos y los pueblos de la única raza humana es motivo de escándalo y atenta contra la justicia social, la equidad, la dignidad humana, como así como la paz social e internacional". (CEC 1938).

Sin embargo, mientras continúa la lucha iniciada por el Dr. Martin Luther King y otros, el Papa Francisco nos recuerda que no perdamos la esperanza: "Construir una nación nos llama a reconocer que debemos relacionarnos constantemente con los demás, rechazando una mentalidad de hostilidad para adoptar uno de subsidiariedad recíproca, en un esfuerzo constante por hacerlo lo mejor posible. Estoy seguro de que podemos hacer esto".
