
#### YOUNG ADULTS

Saint of the Week: St. Maximilian Kolbe, OFM Conv.

Canonized: October 10, 1982 (by St. John Paul II) Feast day: August 14 Born: January 8, 1894, Zdunska Wola, Poland Died: August 14, 1941, Auschwitz concentration camp, Oswiecim, Poland Full name: Maximilian Maria Kolbe Parents: Juliusz Kolbe, Maria Dabrowska

Born on January 8, 1894 in Poland, Maximillian Kolbe became a Conventual Franciscan and in 1918 was ordained a priest in Rome. Out of deep filial devotion to Mary, he established the sodality called the Militia of Mary Immaculate and prometed its growth in Poland and other parts of the world. As a missionary in Japan he labored under the patronage of the Immaculate Virgin to spread the Christian Faith. He returned to Poland and during World War II was imprisoned and suffered great hardship in the concentration camp at Auschwitz. His life of dedication was crowned by his supreme sacrifice of charity on August 14, 1941, when he offered up his own life in place of another prisoner.
