St. Mary's (1854 to 1975) to St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (1975 to 2023) Part 10

Being a Catholic during the nineteenth and twentieth century in St. Mary's was challenging, just as it is today. Seeing the challenges many parishioners were experiencing, the Passionist staffed offered the parish the chance to participate in numerous social and religious organizations. Passionist Father Mark Mesleing (1854-1946) began St. Mary's Lyceum in order "to elevate and develop the young Catholic men of the Parish...and give them the tools...to defend their faith but also to take an intelligent part in the discussion of art, science, literature and politics." Members had their first meeting on December 22, 1891, at the Columbus Hall. So successful was the venture that the three-story St. Mary's Lyceum building was dedicated on June 30, 1892 and formally opened on January 31, 1893.

The St. Mary Record published in 1905 to celebrate the fiftieth anniversary of St. Mary's offered a commentary on some of the Catholic societies in the parish during that era. Included in the Record was The Sons of St. Patrick which began in 1852. St. Mary's Temperance Society which operated from 1861 until 1874. The Emerald Aids Society had its first meeting in 1876 and ceased its mission in 1885.

Military organizations were The Knights of St. Patrick, which begun in 1880 and the Knights of St. Aloysius, whose origins are unknown. In 1878, the Catholic Mutual Benevolent Association began to care for widows and orphans while the L.C.B.A was a benefit society for women. Father Moeslein was an early supporter of the St. Vincent de Paul Society. Finally sodalities included the Infant Jesus Society, the Children of Mary's Sodality, the Immaculate Conception Society and the League of the Sacred Heart. Looking back at the number social and religious organizations that

Ser católico durante los siglos XIX y XX en Santa María era todo un reto, igual que lo es hoy. Al ver los retos que experimentaban muchos feligreses, el personal pasionista ofreció a la parroquia la posibilidad de participar en numerosas organizaciones sociales y religiosas. El padre pasionista Mark Mesleing (1854-1946) fundó el Liceo de Santa María con el fin de "elevar y desarrollar a los jóvenes católicos de la parroquia... y darles las herramientas... para defender su fe pero también para tomar parte inteligente en la discusión del arte, la ciencia, la literatura y la política". Los miembros celebraron su primera reunión el 22 de diciembre de 1891 en el Columbus Hall. El éxito de la empresa fue tal que el edificio de tres plantas del Liceo de Santa María se inauguró el 30 de junio de 1892 y se abrió formalmente el 31 de enero de 1893.

El St. Mary Record publicado en 1905 para celebrar el quincuagésimo aniversario de St. Mary ofrecía un comentario sobre algunas de las sociedades católicas de la parroquia durante esa época. En el Record se incluía a los Hijos de San Patricio, que empezaron en 1852. Mary's Temperance Society que funcionó desde 1861 hasta 1874. The Emerald Aids Society tuvo su primera reunión en 1876 y cesó su misión en 1885.

Las organizaciones militares eran Los Caballeros de San Patricio, que comenzaron en 1880 y los Caballeros de San Luis, cuyos orígenes se desconocen. En 1878, la Catholic Mutual Benevolent Association comenzó a ocuparse de viudas y huérfanos, mientras que la L.C.B.A era una sociedad benéfica para mujeres. El padre Moeslein fue uno de los primeros partidarios de la Sociedad de San Vicente de Paúl. Por último, la Sociedad del Niño Jesús, la Sociedad de los Hijos de María, la Sociedad de la Inmaculada Concepción y la Liga del Sagrado Corazón. (Crónicas del Retiro de Santa María, Dunkerque, NY 1872-1904)

Al recordar la cantidad de organizaciones sociales y religiosas que existieron antaño en la iglesia, uno tiene que preguntarse

por qué no tenemos sociedades u organizaciones religiosas en nuestra iglesia hoy en día.


