Statement on 40 Days for Life Most Reverend Michael W. Fisher Bishop of Buffalo

The Forty Days for Life Campaign, is an ecumenical pro-life effort which has had several successful Spring and Fall campaigns here in Western New York. They have consistently maintained a prayerful, peaceful presence while evangelizing and witnessing for life.

Pope Francis has expressed his public support for the 40 Days for Life ministry that promotes respect for the lives of all unborn children, and says he greatly appreciates the dedicate work that they do in a "Culture of Waste."

It is important to support the outreach and service ministries of the diocese.

This policy allows for consistency in all eight counties of the Diocese of Buffalo and provides a clear way to prioritize and respond to many requests. If you have any questions regarding conducting a specific collection, please contact the Chancery for guidance.

I invite and encourage each of you to join Fr. Peter Karalus on Respect Life Sunday, October 1st, 2023 at St. Joseph Cathedral as we celebrate the Eucharist at 10:30a.m. Fr Peter looks forward to the opportunity to bless babies, expectant mothers and families immediately after Mass. This is also a reminder to please consider your second collection at your parish to support our Diocesan ministries that directly have served over 2,000 families at the 7 locations of the St. Gianna Pregnancy Outreach Centers, The Mother Teresa Home, and the Pietro Molla Men's Outreach.
