SACRISTANS

The role of the Sacristan is a special one in any parish. The Sacristan is responsible for the care and oversight of the sacristy and all of its contents before and after the specific Mass at which they serve as sacristan. The Sacristan sets up the altar before Mass, ensures that the items used during Mass are in their proper place, that the people who assist at Mass (e.g., lectors, altar servers, etc.) are present, etc. Presently, we are in need of one or two persons who would be willing to serve as a Sacristan on a consistent basis for each of the weekend Masses. The person who serves as the Sacristan should not also be an extraordinary minister of Communion, lector, choir member or usher at the Mass at which they are serving as a Sacristan. It is a unique and important role that of great, great help especially to the priest, to ensure that everything is set, people have their questions answered, and Mass begins, proceeds and concludes well. SACRISTÁNES

El papel del Sacristán es especial en cualquier parroquia. El Sacristán es responsable del cuidado y supervisión de la sacristía y todo su contenido antes y después de la Misa específica en la que sirven como sacristán. El sacristán instala el altar antes de la Misa, se asegura de que los artículos utilizados durante la Misa estén en su lugar apropiado, que las personas que asisten a la Misa (por ejemplo, lectores, monaguillos, etc.) estén presentes, etc.

Actualmente, necesitamos una o dos personas que estén dispuestas a servir como sacristán de manera constante para cada una de las misas de fin de semana. La persona que sirve como sacristán no debe ser también un ministro extraordinario de la Comunión, lector, miembro del coro o ujier en la Misa en la que está sirviendo como sacristán. Es un papel único e importante el de gran, gran ayuda especialmente para el sacerdote, para asegurarse de que todo esté listo, las personas tengan sus preguntas respondidas y la Misa comience, transcurra y concluya bien.

Did you know?

Permanent deacons are ordained ministers of the Church who, like bishops and priests, have received the Sacrament of Holy Orders. The word deacon derives from the Greek – "Diakonia" meaning "service," thereby indicating that a deacon is called like Christ to be a servant.

The Order of Deacon has three essential functions: the proclamation of the Gospel, the service of the liturgy, and the administration of charitable works. In particular, the deacon may assist the bishop and the priests in a variety of liturgical functions: Deacons may baptize, witness the exchange of vows and bless marriages, distribute Holy Communion, impart benediction with the Blessed Sacrament, bring Viaticum to the dying, read Sacred Scripture to the faithful, officiate at funerals and burials, and administer sacramentals. Deacons also dedicate themselves to other charitable works, particularly within the parish community. Unlike a priest, deacons cannot absolve sins in the Sacrament of Penance, celebrate the Mass or confect the Holy Eucharist, administer the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, or administer the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Mass with a Deacon:

- When a deacon is present at Mass he has a specific role:
- The deacon proclaims the Gospel and, at times, can offer the Homily.
- The deacon guides the faithful by giving instructions (such as: offering a sign of peace, or bow your head for the blessing) and announces the intentions of the Universal Prayers (Prayers of the Faithful).
- The deacon assists the priest in distributing Communion and may purify the sacred vessels.
- After the final blessing, the deacon gives the dismissal to the people.

For liturgical functions, all deacons wear an alb and a stole that crosses the chest from the left shoulder to the waist on the right side. Deacons may also choose to wear an outer vestment called a dalmatic.

The Order of Deacon, therefore, is part of the hierarchy of the Church and an integral part of the Sacrament of Holy Orders. In all, all deacons should heed the words of St. Polycarp: "Let them be merciful, and zealous, and let them walk according to the truth of the Lord, who became the servant of all."

Road to Renewal Updates - Administration Pillar




