Upgrading the underground chembing system

Despite very rainy weather last summer, we addressed many jobs on our priority list:

* Longation Mork

- A new split rail fence on the southern boundary is mostly installed and will be finished soon.
- The leak-prone underground plumbing was patched several times but needs replacement.
- Fallen and leaning monuments are a continuing problem. We will continue the labor- intensive work of pouring new foundations as weather and time permits. Soil compaction and crumbling of concrete foundations has happened over many years and will take years to solve.
- Progress toward an accurate computerized data base continues. Since accuracy is a priority, this, too, takes time.
- A new snow blower was purchased to facilitate the clearing of grave sites.

Priorities for 2010-2011 are:

- Landscaping and concrete repairs around the Columbarium.
